On February 10, 2021, a team of science librarians (Roxanne Bogucka, Univ. of Texas-Austin; Khue Duong, California State Univ.-Long Beach; Jessica Martinez, Univ. of Idaho; Kelee Pacion, Princeton Univ.; Melanie Radik, Univ. of Massachusetts-Amherst) presented "Journals, journals everywhere, but we should stop and think," at the 2021 (virtual) meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.
